Intriguing discoveries

Leonie Bradley finds out what is on offer at this year's **London Original Print Fair**, Europe's longest running, dedicated print fair




highlight in the print calendar, this year's LOPF makes a splash in March. The Fair is well known for

its established specialist print dealers offering a who's who in printmaking, from old masters to contemporary artists. Alongside these stalwarts, are a crop of new exhibitors, ensuring surprising discoveries for all.

First time exhibitors include, specialists in antiquarian prints, **Isaac and Ede** and, print publisher, **Upsilon Gallery**. Founded just two years ago by Svetlana Sapozhnikova, who used to work with Emanuel von Baeyer, **Vistavka Fine Art**, deal in old master prints and drawings through to 21st century artists, with a uniquely scholarly approach to collecting. Other recently–established exhibitors include: **Brook Street Gallery**, run by a collective of printmakers with a focus on artists' proofs and low–edition prints, and **Soho Revue**, set up by artist James Randell. Asked about showing at LOPF,

James enthused: 'We are hugely excited to show off the output of our new in-house print studio amongst such a rich range of the best contemporary and historical printmaking, and enter ourselves and our artists into that conversation.'

Atelier le Grand Village, a stone lithography studio in France, will be introducing the extraordinary work of South African artist, Diane Victor. Her commanding, graphic works, with a socially and politically driven narrative, are surprisingly little known in the UK, a fact which Atelier founder, Francis van der Riet, is seeking to correct with prints such as *The Goat Who Led the Flock*, an example of the manière noire technique that is a specialism of the Atelier. He will also have copies of Victor's magnificent, recently published monograph *Diane Victor: Prints, Drawings Smoke.*

The Muban Educational Trust,

specialising in Chinese relief prints, who support emerging artists through an annual award, will be showing a selection of work created by their young talent. **The Wrong Shop** will be launching prints from their collaboration with Modern Institute/ Glasgow at the Fair demonstrating their strong belief in the power of collaboration and **Contemporary Tokyo** have proposed the unusually-titled exhibition: *Charming Impressions – A Celebration of Cute Style printmaking*. It really must be witnessed to see how this will be realised! Finally, **Hauser & Wirth**, who have recently set up an editions arm in New York, demonstrate that printmaking is making serious impressions in the art world.
